

de SATGE, Oscar, retired Queensland squatter; *b.* at Elysee Pres D'Ouchy, Switzerland, Nov. 20, 1836, *s.* of the Vicomte and Vicomtesse de Satge de St. Jean, *ed.* Rugby Sch, 1849-53 (won Modern Languages Prize for Lower School). Arrived in Aust. 1858. In the service of Victn. Govt. 1853-4. Was connected for fourteen years with the Peak Downs district, Q'land, having taken up and developed Malvern, Crinum, and Gordon Downs, Retro, and Huntley. Represented Clermont in Q'land Parlt. from 1869 for several sessions, and afterwards sat for Normanby and Mitchell district, then the largest pastoral country in the colony. Has been a magistrate for Q'land since 1861, and for 10 years a Director in London of Peel River Land and Mineral Co. *Author* of Pages from the Journal of a Queensland Squatter (1901). *m.* Aug. 1882, Beatrice, *y. d.* of John Charles Fletcher, of Dale Park, Sussex. *Club*—Junior Carlton. *Address*—Elysee, Shorncliffe Rd., Folkestone, Eng.

DESHON, Edward, C.M.G., Trustee of Agricultural Bank Queensland since 1902; *b.* Belgaum, Bombay Presidency, Jan. 3, 1836, *s.* of the late Lt.-Col. C. J. Deshon, 17th Regt., *ed.* Bath Gram. Sch. Served with 68th Light Infantry 1854-61, and was at the siege of Sebastopol to the end of the Crimean war (Crimean medal with clasp and Turkish medal). Arrived in Aust. in 1862, joined the Q'land public service July 1865, appointed Under Secretary for Public Lands 1882, member of the Land Bd. Dec. 1884, and Auditor-General Dec. 1889; retired on a pension Aug. 1901. *Decorated* 1902. *m.* Aug. 1863, Emily, *d.* of J. D. Sawyer. *Club*—Queensland. *Address*—Kemmendine, Coorparoo, Q'land.

DE VIS, Charles W., M.A. (Cantab.), Curator of the Queensland Museum for many years, now consulting specialist of the institution. *Address*—Brisbane.

DIBBS, Thomas Allwright, General Manager of the Commercial Banking Co. of Sydney Ltd. since 1867; *b.* George St., Sydney, Oct. 31, 1832, *s.* of Capt. John Dibbs, of St. Andrews, Scotland, *ed.* Australian Coll. Jamieson St. Sydney. Joined the Commercial Banking Co. July 1847, and appointed accountant 1857. Was on the Royal Commission on the Public Service Enquiry Bd. 1888, President of the Comte. of Enquiry into Public Accounts 1900, has been Trustee and Treasurer of church organizations in many of the funds of the Church of England in the Diocese of Sydney, Trustee of the Naval Home and of the Kuringgai Chase, also Commodore of the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron, succeeding Lord Beauchamp. *m.* Mar. 11, 1857, Tryphena Gaden; eight children—*e. s.* Tom Burton Dibbs, of Dibbs & Parker, solicitors, Sydney. *Recreations*—Reading, yachting, gardening. *Address*—George St., Sydney.

DICK, Hon. William Thomas, M.L.A. of N.S.W., sits for Newcastle. Honorary Minister since Aug. 1904, *ed.* Sydney Univ., B.A., LL.B.

DIXON, Hugh, President of The British Australasian Tobacco Company, Chairman of Directors of the City Bank of Sydney (established 1863), formerly President of Syd-

ney Y.M.C.A., and takes a prominent part in religious and philanthropic movements. He is a leading horticulturist and exhibitor. *Address*—Abergeldie, Summer Hill, Sydney.

DOBBIE, Edward David, Solicitor-General and Crown Solicitor, Tasmania. Called to the bar 1882, and joined the civil service 1888. *Address*—Sandy Bay, Hobart.

DOBSON, Hon. Alfred, O.M.G., K.O., Agent-General for Tasmania in England since Apr. 1901, and has also acted from time to time as Agent-General for Victoria; *b.* Hobart, Aug. 18, 1848, *s.* of late John Dobson. Called to the bar at the Inner Temple 1875, and is a K.O. of Tas. M.H.A. for Glenorchy 1877-87, Attorney-General in the Fysh and Giblin Ministries 1877-8, held the non-political and permanent position of Solicitor-General and Grand Juror of Tasmania; was also Speaker of the House of Assembly 1885-7. *Decorated* Nov. 1904. *m.* 1891, Alice Ramsay, *d.* of Rt. Rev. Dr. Sandford, formerly Bishop of Tasmania and lately Assistant Bishop of Durham. *Clubs*—Union and St. Stephen's. *Address*—187 Queen's Gate, London.

DOBSON, Hon. Henry, Senator for Tasmania since Mar. 1901; *b.* Hobart, Dec. 24, 1841, *s.* of John Dobson, *ed.* The Hutchins Sch. Hobart. Called to Tas. bar 1864, and member of the firm of Dobson, Mitchell, and Allport. M.H.A. for Brighton 1891-9, leader of the Opposition 1891-2, Premier 1892-4, represented Tas. in the Federal Council of A'asia, and member of the National Convention which framed the Commonwealth Constitution 1897-8. *m.* Emily Lempriere, of Melbourne. *Recreations*—Reading, music, excursions in the country. *Clubs*—Tasmanian and Athenaeum, Hobart. *Address*—Hobart.

DOCKER, Ernest Brougham, District Court Judge New South Wales—North-western Dist. 1881 and Western Dist. since 1884; *b.* Thornthwaite, nr. Scone, N.S.W., Apr. 1, 1842, *s.* of the late Hon. Joseph Docker, M.L.C., who was several times Minister of the Crown, *ed.* Collegiate Sch. Cook's River and Sydney Univ. (Denison Scholarship St. Paul's Coll. 1860, University medal for English verse 1861, Wentworth medal for English essay 1862, B.A. 1863, M.A. 1865). Called to the N.S.W. bar June 20, 1867, Crown Prosecutor 1875, appointed Judge to hold a Court at Norfolk Island 1894. Is a member of the Council of the King's School, of Synod of the Sydney Diocese and of Bathurst Diocese and has been President of the Photographic Soc. of N.S.W. since 1894. *Author* of Hymns of the Kingdom (sacred verse 1876). *m.* June 25, 1873, Clarissa Mary, *d.* of the late Ven. Archdn. J. K. Tucker, D.D., of Wangaratta; two sons and seven daughters. *Recreations*—Cricket (till recently), tennis, shooting, photography, whist, bridge. *Club*—Australian. *Address*—Eltham, Edgecliff Rd., Sydney.

DODDS, Hon. Sir John Stokell, K.O.M.G., Chief Justice of Tasmania since 1898; *b.* Durham, Eng., 1848, *s.* of William Dodds, grandfather for many years Vicar of Kirkleatham, Yorkshire, and descended on maternal side from a younger branch of the Shut-
